It's set to be a short term 5, but still a busy one. Teachers have prepared another round of exciting learning for your children. I have included an overview for each year group below:

Reception: From Farm to Fork: We will be learning about the life cycle of a butterfly and observing the changes that happen. We will be learning about where our food comes from and linking this to keeping healthy and looking after ourselves. We are hoping to visit a supermarket to buy some healthy food.

Year 1: The Secret Garden: In our project for term 5, the children will become expert plant and tree identifiers. Children will develop their scientific skills by investigating exactly what a plant needs to grow. The children will also look at seasonal weather changes and even compare the UK to China or Mexico!

Year 2: London's Burning: This term we are looking in more detail at fire safety and will continue our research with a visit to the new Fire Station. The children will collect information which they will then use to write their own fire safety information text.

Year 3: Our Evolving Environment: We are learning about Ramsgate and how it has evolved over the past 100 years or so, looking at land use, transport, historical importance and causes for these changes. We will be exploring both the history and the geography of the region and comparing it with others.

Year 4: Struggle for the Kingdom: This term year 4 are learning about the Vikings and Anglo Saxons. Children will be focusing on the



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Viking Raids and the invasion of Britain; the resistance by Alfred the Great and Athelstan who was the first king of England; Anglo Saxon laws and their justice system. Through our project we will also be using atlases to locate the countries that the Vikings invaded. In ICT, we are creating a perfect poster using Microsoft Word, which will be about the Viking invasion as the struggle to secure the Kingdom.

Year 5: Thanet Earth: This term we will be looking at Cinque Ports and their limbs. Sandwich was a Cinque port and Minster, Sarre and Ramsgate being a limb. We will also look at how ports have changed, focusing on Dover port and how that has grown, and what happens there. A study of Broadstairs will also be covered - looking at where the name came from; how it developed as a seaside port and tourism today.

Year 6: The Memorial: This term year 6 will be learning about the period around WWI and the impact that the war had on society. We will look at this in a variety of fun and interesting ways throughout the curriculum; studying the books 'Memorium', 'Private Peaceful' and 'War Horse' in English and Read, Lead, Succeed; and venturing out to the local community to see the ways in which the war affected the people of Thanet and how it is commemorated.
