Term 5 and term 6 assessments

Here is an overview of the statutory tests to be completed, as determined by the Department for Education.

Year 6

Our Year 6 children will complete their end of Key Stage 2 Statutory Assessments in SPAG (spelling, punctuation & grammar); reading and maths. The dates are set by the DfE and the tests must be administered under test conditions. Our year 6 children are already used to this process and have completed a series of 'mocks' in order to prepare themselves of what to expect. We have been working on helping the children to achieve their very best so they enter secondary school with a solid foundation of knowledge to work from.

Monday 13th May: English grammar, punctuation and spelling (paper 1 and 2)

Tuesday 14th May: Reading

Wednesday 15th May: Maths paper 1 (arithmetic) and maths paper 2 (reasoning)

Thursday 16th May: Maths paper 3 (reasoning)

Year 4

From 3rd June to 21st June, our Year 4 pupils will complete the statutory multiplication check. There will be more information to follow in term 5, but in the meantime, please support your child in recalling their times tables (up to 12 x 12). 'Times tables rockstars' is perfect for this! Also, the benefits of quick fire questions over breakfast and dinner will also help your child's rapid recall of times tables facts.

Year 2

This year, the end of Key Stage 1 SATs have had their status changed to 'optional'. With this in mind, we will instead use our school assessment systems to finalise progress and attainment. We will take sample questions from the SATs papers to help make our assessment conclusions, but this will be completed in an informal and non-pressurised way.

Year 1

During the week commencing 10th June, our Year 1 children will complete the phonics screening check which is used as a tool to see how well children have secured their ability to use synthetic phonics. The screening check is carried out in a 1:1 situation. Again, the children are used to this process and simply see it as time with Mrs Bradbury to go out and read!





BULLYING DEFINITION

We continue to operate a zero tolerance policy of bullying. We encourage the children to speak out when they feel uncomfortable or spot someone else being made to feel this way. Our bullying definition helps the children to understand the difference between friendship issues that they need help with and bullying:

Repeated negative behaviours that are intended to make others feel upset, uncomfortable or unsafe.

RACISM

Like all schools country-wide, we continue to find ways to tackle racism and encourage diversity. At DJPA, we plan and deliver assemblies focusing on diversity, each term. We thoughtfully consider Black History month and consider how we are all different: neurodiverse, culturally and spiritually.

In order to tackle racism further and grow children into tolerant and respectful adults, we are going to trial the use of a racism definition next term. This definition will help us to be clear and consistent about the way others should be treated.

Please join us in supporting your child with the understanding that:

"Racism is when people are treated unfairly because of their skin colour or background. It happens when people are called names or deliberately hurt or left out because of their skin colour or background."

We are hearing of children learning some awful language and racist phrases when they are playing on their electronic devices, specifically when using headsets with communities on online games. If you'd like some more support with online privacy settings for your child, please reach out.
