Change to school hours

The Government expect all schools to offer a 32.5 hour school week by September 2024, at the latest. For most schools this means an adjustment in the core learning hours, and includes us at Dame Janet. This means that we will need to extend our school day for all children in years R to 6 to ensure that children are at school for 6.5 hours each day. I will write to you in the new year with the proposed new timings. We will trial the new timings in the first instance with them likely coming into effect at the start of term 5 (after Easter). Children in Shorty's Nursery will remain unaffected by the changes.





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




Reading at Dame Janet

The ability to read confidently and fluently in order to fully enjoy books is something that we really value at Dame Janet. They continue to choose books from their 'ZPD' (book level) - hopefully they'll be some time to listen to your children read over the festive break. Children will be able to complete their Accelerated Reader guiz on their return.
