

## Sports Premium Strategy - Dame Janet Primary Academy 2021-2022

PE and Sports Premium	
The government is providing £16,000 and an additional payment of £10 per pupil for each school with 17 or more eligible pupils to improve provision of Physical Education (PE) and sport in primary schools. The funding – provided jointly by the Departments for Education, Health and culture, Media and Sport – will be allocated to primary school head teachers. This funding is ring-fenced and therefore can only be spent on provision of PE and sport in schools.

<b>B.</b>	To allow pupils the opportunities to experience a wide range of both team and individual sports, delivered by staff passionate about sport to build character, develop team work, a sense of fairness and respect. Seasonal pupil conferencing will demonstrate that 85% of all pupils are able to report on the values needed to partake in competitive and team sports.

<u>Sports coach</u> Contract with Total Sports Coaching offering full time Sports Coaches to facilitate the continued development of sport across the academy.	£16,000
<u>Swimming</u> Hire of qualified swim teachers, cost of hire of swimming pool and transportation to the pool.	£1,400
<u>Sports equipment</u> Maintaining resources for PE, school sports, playtime sports and extra-curricular activities.	£1,000
<u>Teach Active</u> Teachers to be upskilled in their delivery of QFT PE and games sessions due to working alongside specialist PE staff. Staff knowledge improves with lesson plans supplied with training to sustain their professional development .	£975
<u>Thanet Passport</u> Sports funding is covering the cost of Thanet Passport prescription, which opens up the opportunities for children to engage in across school competitions in a range of sports. Thanet Passport also offers and supports CPD needs for sports leaders and teachers in order to improve PE teaching and learning across the Academy.	£650
