

# KS1 Why do Jewish families say so many prayers and blessings?

## Prior learning

## What should we know?

Jewish people:

- Say prayers and blessings to God because it reminds them how great God is.
- Say thank you to God for all he provides.
- Have a day of rest each week called Shabbat.
- Pray at both home and the synagogue.
- Sometimes wear special clothes.

## What words should we understand and be able to use?

<b>Sukkah</b>	A special hut built during the festival Sukkot.		<b>Synagogue</b>	Known as the 'House of Prayer,' a Jewish community house.
<b>Shabbat</b>	The Jewish day of rest.		<b>Tallit</b>	Jewish prayer shawl.
<b>Kippah</b>	A head covering for Jews.		<b>Havdalah ceremony</b>	marks the end of Shabbat.
